OALA MEMBER RECOGNITION ON LANDSCAPE ONTARIO AWARDS

An OALA member brought to my attention an issue related to providing our members with appropriate credit for their design work on Landscape Ontario (LO) design build awards. I personally have encountered this situation and took the complaint very seriously. I wrote to LO Executive Director Tony DiGiovanni. After raising my concerns through a number of exchanges, I asked that LO correct this issue by revising the awards entry forms to allow for credits due for the designer, OALA member or other. I am pleased to advise that LO has agreed and I have assurance from Tony this will occur. I would ask our members to monitor this for the 2011 awards late fall/winter. It is important that credits are given where appropriate to members or other designers of design build construction. As President, I am interested in advancing the profession at every opportunity possible. This is a pivotal time for the Association. If issues arise that Council need to be aware of, please let us know. They will be heard by Council and given the weight warranted.

CITY OF OTTAWA CLAY SOILS- LAO initiates discussion with City staff to address this critical issue

Approximately ten years ago, the City of Ottawa adopted policies restricting the planting of streetscape trees in new residential developments in areas of Leda clays to prevent or minimize damage to foundations. In some cases, planting of smaller shrub like trees are permitted.

These restrictions, combined with shrinking lot sizes, increasing densities, conflicts with buried utilities and urban intensification, resulted in fewer and fewer trees being planted in new residential projects. Several dozen new suburban residential communities with hundreds of new homes each were often completed with an alarming absence of new trees, big or small.

Landscape Architecture Ottawa got together to study the problem with the hope of finding a solution that would respect the City's concerns about liability: the Trees in Clay Soils Task Force comprising of local landscape architects in private and public practice was formed. The Task Force invited James Urban, noted arborist and landscape architect, to conduct

a symposium on trees in clay soils. This symposium invited members of professional disciplines and fields related to urban forestry, arboriculture, planning, landscape architecture and engineering and the biological sciences, as well as the general public, to explore issues relating to trees in clay soils.

The conclusions noted: 1-trees are only one factor in the dewatering effects on clay soils, and 2- there was a low incidence of tree-related foundation damage that had been observed or reported by City staff over the past two decades, and the City's restrictions do not appear to be justified.

The Trees in Clay Soils Task Force has decided to make a written request to the City's General Manager of Planning and Growth Management to consider easing the restrictions on tree planting.
